Fife Club is an opportunity to learn a new instrument from scratch for an affordable cost, playing together in a fun group setting! Includes free loan of instrument during sessions, and instruments can be purchased at an affordable cost for those wishing to practice at home.

Playing in a musical group helps to build confidence and ability, gain experience of playing in an ensemble and learn performance skills.

Limited places will be allocated on a strict first come first serve basis. Apply early to avoid disappointment!

Fife Club takes place at St Albans Music School (based at Townsend School, High Oaks, St Albans, on Wednesdays, 4:30 – 5:10pm. It is suitable for children in Year 4 and above and costs £59 for the term (9 sessions including concert). **Please note this group takes place outside your child's school.**

6. Click on Short courses/Workshop
7. Choose 'Fife Club' and 'Add to Basket'
8. Fill in the full details to complete registration. If you already have an account with us, you will then get the opportunity to login with your existing information.

If your child continues to come along to the ensemble after the trial session, you will be invoiced for the ensemble.

### About PARC & The Skatepark Project

PARC is a local charity (Charity No. 1179147), established in 2018, to raise funds to build an exciting new play area in Rothamsted Park. This has been achieved and our next goal is to replace the Rothamsted Park Skatepark, which is at end of life.

PARC is working closely with Harpenden Town Council to make this a reality. HTC has pledged £100,000 towards the project & the design proposal is currently with the Local Planning Authority, with a decision due back by Winter 2023.

Additional funding is still needed to reach the £250,000 target and we are appealing to local businesses and the wider community to support us.
